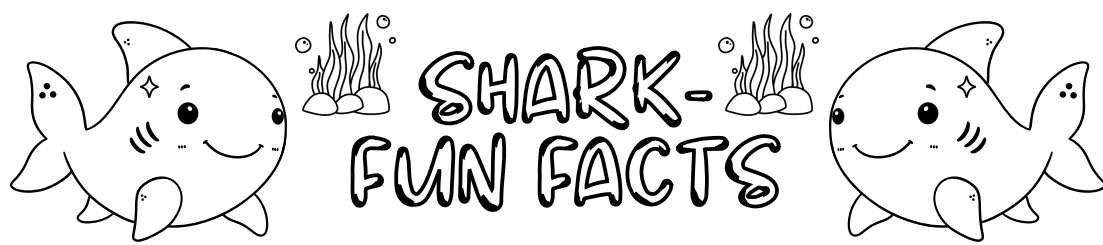
Some sharks, like the lantern shark, can glow in the dark.

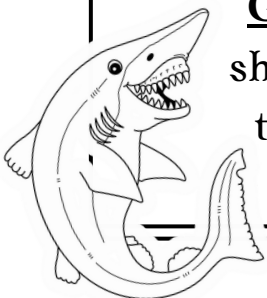
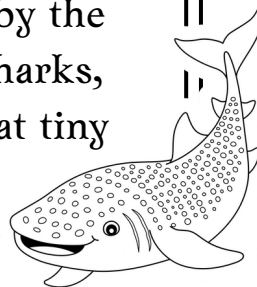


GREAT WHITE SHARKS: These are the most famous sharks, often seen in movies. They can grow up to 20 feet long and have rows of sharp teeth!.

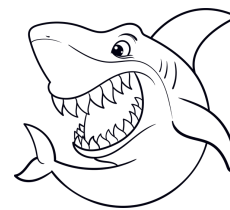


HAMMERHEAD SHARKS: This shark's head looks like a hammer! Its wide head helps it see better and find food.

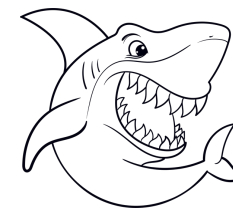
WHALE SHARKS: Don't be fooled by the name! Whale sharks are the largest sharks, growing over 40 feet long. But they eat tiny things like plankton!



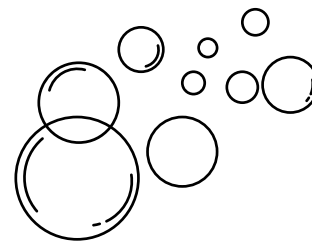
GOBLIN SHARKS: This deep-sea shark has a long, flat snout and sharp teeth. It looks a little spooky and is rarely seen by people.



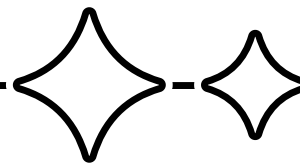

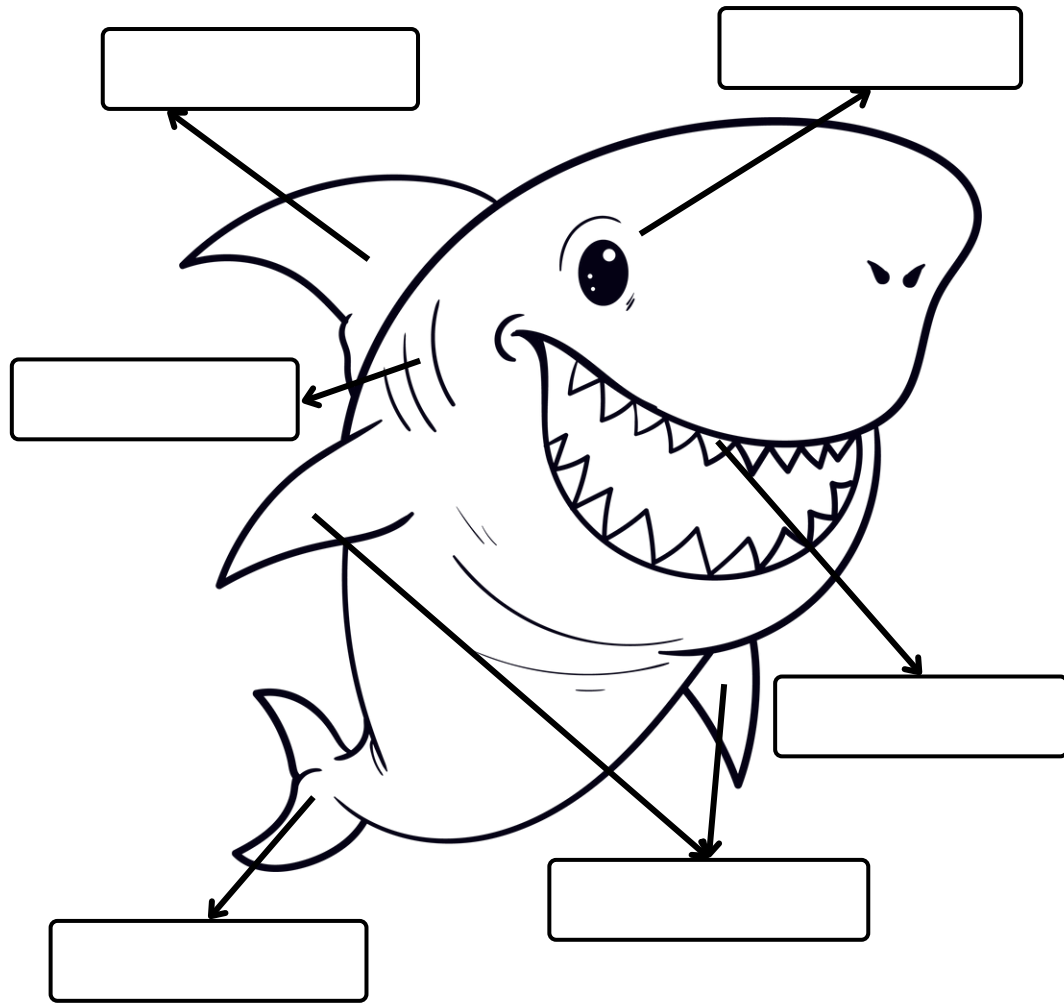

Dorsal Fin – The fin on top of the shark's body that keeps it steady while swimming.

Gills – Slits on the sides of the shark's head that help it breathe underwater.

Pectoral Fins – These fins are on the sides near the head. They help the shark steer and balance.

Tail (Caudal Fin) – The tail fin helps push the shark forward through the water.

Eyes – Sharks can see very well, even in the dark depths of the ocean.

Teeth – Sharks have multiple rows of sharp teeth, and they can grow new ones throughout their lives!

SHARKS CAN SENSE MOVEMENT AND VIBRATIONS IN THE WATER WITH THEIR SPECIAL FINS AND SKIN.



✓ CARNIVOROUS SHARKS

These sharks eat other animals like fish, seals, and squid.

They have sharp, pointed teeth that help them grab, tear, and swallow their food.

Examples:

- Great White Shark
- Tiger Shark
- Hammerhead Shark

COOL FACT

Carnivorous sharks lose and regrow thousands of teeth during their lives — some can lose a tooth every week!

✓ FILTER-FEEDING SHARKS

- These gentle giants swim with their mouths open, filtering tiny food from the water.
- They eat plankton, krill, and small sea creatures.

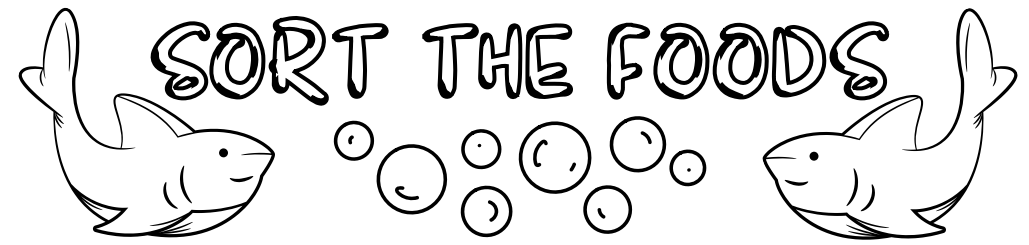
They have tiny teeth and special filters in their mouths to catch their food!
